NIGHT 1 [9/10 or 9/21] Board boat at Procida SunSail base at 6:00 p.m. 5:00 'Welcome' Cocktail Party. Eat ashore in PROCIDA, Board after 6:00 pm, spend night aboard.

NIGHT 2 [9/11 or 9/22] Sail 9 mi to Sant'Angelo, ISCHIA €145

After provisioning it's a short sail from the base is the quaint fishing village of Sant'Angelo on south side of Ischia. The beauty of the island was immortalized in Cleopatra, filmed on the island.

NIGHT 3 or NIGHT 5 [9/12 or 9/25] Sail 16 mi to Marina Grande, CAPRI €380

The island of Capri has been a much-loved resort since Roman times, and continues to attract well-heeled holidaymakers today. We'll dock at the high end Marina Grande or head for anchorage on Capri's southern side. Capri's cliffs, caves and grottos make for spectacular scenery and good hiking with fine views over the Tyrrhenian. Visit the ruined Roman villa of Vill Jovis, located on a high cliff face offering spectacular views and fascinating antiquities.

NIGHT 4 or NIGHT 3 [9/13 or 9/23] 6 mi Nerano, mooring ball

A change of pace from the marina activity of Capri and Amalfi, Nerano offers a quiet night on a mooring ball, off Cantuccio restaurant, renowned for its food and stunning view on the water's edge. The shore boat will deliver us to and from the dock.

NIGHT 4 or NIGHT 5 [9/14 or 9/24] 18 mi to Marina Coppola, AMALFI €220

The town of Amalfi is located in the heart of the glamorous Amalfi Coast. Sail a stretch of coastline renowned as one of the most breathtaking on Earth before mooring at Marina Coppola in the company of speedboats and superyachts. Amalfi is home to a sparkling bay backed by gently curving beaches, narrow alleyways brimming with local produce and picturesque homes built into the craggy cliff face. You'll want to stay in this beautiful town for good.

NIGHT 6 and NIGHT 7 [9/15 & 16 or 9/26 & 27] to Sorrento / Marina di Cassano SORRENTO €145/night

Sorrento is the gateway to the Amalfi coast, a place where lemon groves, towering cliffs and magnificent vistas converge. Overlooking the Bay of Naples, it comes as no surprise that this brochure-worthy coastal town has attracted famous artists for decades. Enjoy sweeping water views and delicious lunches in the bustling café-lined square of Piazza Tasso. Or, head to Marina Grande a small fisherman's village where pastel colored houses meet fresh local seafood.

This is our Layover Day* — Tour the volcano, neighboring farms, countryside or local markets.

NIGHT 8 [9/17 or 9/28] 21 mi Castello Aragonese anchorage, ISCHIA

Since the fifth century BC, this rock has been a citadel for the Greeks, Romans and others. It's dramatic castle was built by Alfonso I of Aragon in the 15th century AD. We'll anchor in the bay at the foot of this picturesque fortress, have a swim and dinner aboard.


NIGHT 9 / [9/18 or 9/29] 22 mi to Forio, ISCHIA €145

This gem is a favorite among Naples residents due to the beauty of its beaches (including the famous Baia di Citara) and for its charming historic center with noble palazzi, art shops, and small artisan boutiques. Considered the cultural heart of the island, Forio is full of artisan and art workshops. From the water we'll look for the famous Saracen watchtowers built along the coastline centuries ago that have stood watch over the Bay of Naples throughout history.

NIGHT 10 (9/19 or 9/30) 5 mi Return to Procida Base
